*Judges 3:1-11 Pew Bible pages 253-254*

<sup>1</sup>Now these are the nations which the LORD left, to test Israel by them (that is, all who had not experienced any of the wars of Canaan;

<sup>2</sup>only in order that the generations of the sons of Israel might be taught war, those who had not experienced it formerly).

<sup>3</sup>These nations are: the five lords of the Philistines and all the Canaanites and the Sidonians and the Hivites who lived in Mount Lebanon, from Mount Baal-hermon as far as Lebo-hamath.

<sup>4</sup>They were for testing Israel, to find out if they would obey the commandments of the LORD, which He had commanded their fathers through Moses.

<sup>5</sup>The sons of Israel lived among the Canaanites, the Hittites, the Amorites, the Perizzites, the Hivites, and the Jebusites;

<sup>6</sup>and they took their daughters for themselves as wives, and gave their own daughters to their sons, and served their gods.

<sup>7</sup>The sons of Israel did what was evil in the sight of the LORD, and forgot the LORD their God and served the Baals and the Asheroth.

<sup>8</sup>Then the anger of the LORD was kindled against Israel, so that He sold them into the hands of Cushan-rishathaim king of Mesopotamia; and the sons of Israel served Cushan-rishathaim eight years.

<sup>9</sup>When the sons of Israel cried to the LORD, the LORD raised up a deliverer for the sons of Israel to deliver them, Othniel the son of Kenaz, Caleb's younger brother.

<sup>10</sup>The Spirit of the LORD came upon him, and he judged Israel. When he went out to war, the LORD gave Cushan-rishathaim king of Mesopotamia into his hand, so that he prevailed over Cushan-rishathaim.

<sup>11</sup>Then the land had rest forty years. And Othniel the son of Kenaz died.

<sup>1</sup>Now the Philistines gathered their armies for battle; and they were gathered at Socoh which belongs to Judah, and they camped between Socoh and Azekah, in Ephes-dammim.

<sup>2</sup>Saul and the men of Israel were gathered and camped in the valley of Elah, and drew up in battle array to encounter the Philistines.

<sup>3</sup>The Philistines stood on the mountain on one side while Israel stood on the mountain on the other side, with the valley between them.

<sup>4</sup>Then a champion came out from the armies of the Philistines named Goliath, from Gath, whose height was six cubits and a span.

<sup>5</sup>He had a bronze helmet on his head, and he was clothed with scale-armor which weighed five thousand shekels of bronze.

<sup>6</sup>He also had bronze greaves on his legs and a bronze javelin slung between his shoulders.

<sup>7</sup>The shaft of his spear was like a weaver's beam, and the head of his spear weighed six hundred shekels of iron; his shield-carrier also walked before him.

<sup>8</sup>He stood and shouted to the ranks of Israel and said to them, "Why do you come out to draw up in battle array? Am I not the Philistine and you servants of Saul? Choose a man for yourselves and let him come down to me.

<sup>9</sup>"If he is able to fight with me and kill me, then we will become your servants; but if I prevail against him and kill him, then you shall become our servants and serve us."

<sup>10</sup>Again the Philistine said, "I defy the ranks of Israel this day; give me a man that we may fight together."

<sup>11</sup>When Saul and all Israel heard these words of the Philistine, they were dismayed and greatly afraid.

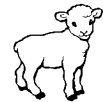

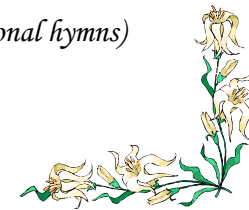

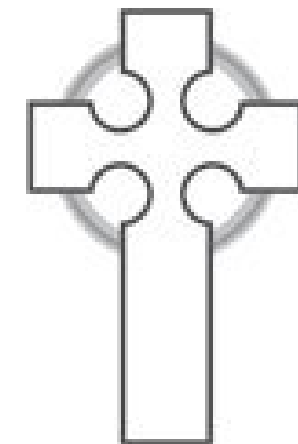
